Use the Catalog

Type in these search words:

children's plays and juvenile

readers and theatre and juvenile

Shakespeare and plays and juvenile

monologues and juvenile

improvisation and juvenile

From KidsWeb, click on Homework Help-> Next, click on Drama and Theatre > scroll down the page for Kids databases and magazines that may help with this subject. (From home, you will need your library card number and PIN to access any PPLD database).
