Math

How do I find information about math at the library?

Use the Catalog

catalog.ppld.org

Type in these example search words:

mathematics and juvenile
arithmetic and juvenile
addition and juvenile
subtraction and juvenile

Or type in other math words like: counting, multiplication, division, fractions, time money, etc.

Try Kids Web

ppld.org/Kids

From KidsWeb, click Homework Help->Next, click on Math->scroll down the page for the best Kids Databases and Kids Magazines for math. (From home, you will need your library card number and PIN to access these databases.)

What does Juvenile (J) mean?

Juvenile is another name for kid or child. Books with a "J" at the beginning of the call number are written for children.
